

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Types of Schools

Thai Government Schools



Thai government schools provide education in Thai mainly to Thai nationals. These schools follow the Thai

academic school calendar. Class sizes are usually large, over 35 students and are expected to wear a uniform. Boys are expected to have short haircuts and girls to have their hair done daily. To attend a Thai university, Thai's must graduate from a Thai government school, a Thai Private School or another institution that teaches the Thai curriculum.

Thai Private Schools



Private schools follow the Thai national curriculum and the Thai academic school calendar. Schools offer bilingual, triingual, English Program (EP) and International English Program (IEP). The IEP is not to be confused with international school education as it is not an accredited program. Facilities at Thai private schools are generally more modern and foreign teachers are more qualified. Class sizes are typically large over 30 students.

Types of Schools

Private Schools



Private schools offer daycare, preschool or kindergarten. Most of these institutions use play-based learning. The majority of private schools follow the Thai academic calendar and many offer daily, weekly, monthly, or term fees. Class sizes are usually smaller and the facilities are really good. All nationalities can attend private schools and programs are taught either in Thai, English, or a mix of both. Some schools are also offering Chinese.

International Schools



International schools are accredited institutions often with the best facilities. International schools in Thailand follow the international school academic calendar and curricula vary widely. Class sizes are typically no more than 25 students and most international schools in Chiang Mai require students to wear a uniform. All nationalities can attend international schools, although Thai nationals may not be able to attend a Thai university if they haven't completed a Thai curriculum and ONET exams.

School Calendars



When does school start and end in Thailand?

There are 2 school calendar years in Thailand - an international school and a Thai academic calendar. Each comes with varying holidays and term breaks with 23 national holidays throughout the year

Thai School Calendar

Thai school will begin early May and take a 2-3 week midterm break in October. There will be a short new year holiday in January and the school year ends in March. Summer lasts from mid-March to early May. Some private schools may offer a week off at Christmas as well.

International schools begin early to mid-August and take a 1-2 week midterm break in October. There will another 2-3 week holiday for Christmas and New Year. British schools will have a 1 week mid-term February break and all schools will take 1-2 weeks off in April for Songkran. Summer lasts 6-8 weeks depending, from mid-June to early August.

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Chiang Mai is known as the education hub of the north and you'll find many choices for curriculum. Knowing and understanding what each curriculum offers will be an important determining factor in deciding which school to send your child(ren) to. Each type is explained in subsequent pages.

Types of Curriculum



How to Choose the Right Curriculum

How do you know which curriculum is the right one? One of the first things you want to consider is where your family roots are. For example, if you are from the United States, an American Curriculum will be applicable should your family return to the United States.

Another aspect to consider is your family's pedagogy or view on education. Do you want a strong and focused academic education? Would you prefer your child to learn through play? Do you want your child's progress assessed through standardized testing? Would a holistic and whole-child approach be best? Each type of curriculum differs and some schools offer an overlap between these options.

It is also worth considering how long you will live in Thailand and whether your child(ren) is a Thai national. Thai Private Schools or Bilingual schools would be best to solidify learning the Thai language. They also offer the curriculum requirements to get into higher education within Thailand.

To access higher education outside of Thailand, it is best to consider curriculum choices offered by accredited international schools.

We hope to make choosing the right curriculum easier for you by providing more details on each curriculum type in the coming pages.



The British Curriculum taught at international schools is largely based on the Cambridge Curriculum. A variety of subject studies are taught including English, Social Studies (Geography and History), Mathematics Science, Personal, Social, Health and Economics (PSHE), Humanities, Art, and more.

Cambridge students develop an informed curiosity and a lasting passion for learning through deep subject knowledge and the conceptual understanding that helps students make links between different aspects of a subject. Students are also encouraged to develop higher-order thinking skills - problem-solving, critical thinking, independent research, collaboration and presenting arguments.

It is common for international schools to tailor the UK National Curriculum and Cambridge Curriculum to meet local culture, ethos, and their students' needs.

The British Curriculum is divided into 'Key Stages' (KS) and students are formally assessed at the end of each Key Stage. Within the Key Stages are year groups:

Early Years Nursery (Ages 2 to 3)

Reception (Ages 3 to 5)

Primary

KS1 - Year 1 and 2 (Ages 5 to 7) KS2 - Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 (Ages 7 to 11) Secondary


KS3 - Year 7, 8, and 9 (Ages 11 to 14) KS4 - Year 10 and 11 (Ages 14 to 16)

KS5 - - Year 12 and 13 (Ages of 16 to 18)

Students who are taught the British Curriculum sit end of year Progression Tests in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6. Students completing KS2 and KS3 take the Cambridge Checkpoint and (I)GCSE examinations at the end of Key Stage 4 and A-Levels at the end of Key Stage 5.

Both (I)GCSE and A-Levels e qualifications are highly regarded by universities in the United Kingdom and the rest of the world.

American Curriculum



International American Curriculum is often adapted by international schools to meet school ethos, local cultural differences and student needs. The core subjects taught at each level are English Language, Arts, Mathematics, Physical Education, Science and Social Studies (History and Geography). During High School, students are exposed to Visual and Performing Arts, Foreign Languages, and Technology.

The school structure divides learning into five sections as follows:

Pre-kindergarten (Ages 2-5) Middle School

Kindergarten (Ages 5-6) Grades 7-8 (Ages 12-14)

Elementary School High School


Grades 1-6 (Ages 6-11) Grades 9-12 (Ages 14-18)

The American system also tends to use much more standardized testing throughout schooling which is in line with the Common Core standards that many international American schools follow.

International schools following the American Curriculum should also offer Advanced Placement (AP) courses beginning in Grade 10. AP courses give students an advantage when it comes to applying to higher education institutions in America.

At the end of Grade 12, students are awarded an American High School Diploma. If students choose, in Grade 12 they have the opportunity to sit for standardized tests such as the SAT, PSAT (Practice SAT) and ACT to measure their knowledge in certain subject areas. Scores from these standardized tests are also an entry requirement by many American colleges

Singapore Curriculum



ternational schools that follow the Singapore Curriculum usually follow the guidance of the Desired Outcomes of Education (DOE). The DOE focuses on student excellence in subject knowledge, life and knowledge skills. This is taught th lues; character development, self-management skills, social and cooperative skills, literacy and numeracy, communication skills, information skills, thinking skills and creativity, and knowledge application skills.

Education levels are structured follows:

Kindergarten (Ages 5 and under)
Primary

Primary 1-6 (Ages 6-11)

Secondary
Secondary 1-5 (Ages 12-16)
Preuniversity
Preuniversity 1-3 (Ages 17-19)

Assessment during Primary years is typically informal until the end of Primary 6. At this point students are to take the Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE), although international schools may opt for another form of assessment such as Cambridge Checkpoint Exams if they are also a Cambridge school. The PSLE results are used to place students into a band of learning for Secondary level. The bands are Special, Express, Normal Technical or Normal Academic. International schools using the Singapore Curriculum may not follow such streaming of education.

At the end of Secondary, students will sit the iGCE or A-Level Examinations which is similar to the British or Cambridge curriculums. These examination results are highly regarded by universities and companies in the United Kingdom and the rest of the world.

German Curriculum

The German Curriculum is focused around setting boundaries, encouraging independent learning, and building character. From early childhood children are given clear expectations and boundaries and learn to live respectfully and practice tolerance in a community of their peers.

There is an emphasis on independence and development of critical thinking skills and the creation of an environment where each child can learn and grow at their own pace.

The German school structure is designed as follows:

Créches (Ages 1-3) Sekundarstufe I

Grades 5-10 (Ages 11-16)

Kindergarten (Ages 3-6)

Sekundarstufe II

Grundschule Grades 1-4 (Ages 6-10) Grades 11-12 (Ages 16-18)

At the end of Sekundarstufe II (Upper Secondary), students will take the Abitur (equivalent to A-levels).

While the language of instruction is German, preschool students are accepted into German international schools regardless of their mother tongue, as all students are learning German, English, and even French in some schools. Students in lower grades of Elementary School may also gain admission with no German language proficiency depending on a number of other factors - please check with your local school for specifics.

Students looking to enter Grades 4 or 5, it is possible for motivated families whose children can handle an intensive German language introduction alongside the grade- level curriculum in other subjects.

Chinese **CURRENT Curriculum



Chinese Curriculum schools follow China's long-term education reform mandated by the Ministry of Education of the People's Republic of China. The reform is based upon building people who are ready and capable in today's world. The new approach consists of courses that encourage all-around development of individual learners.

Schools following the Chinese Curriculum offer courses like Morality, Chinese, Mathematics, Physical Education and Art to primary students in lower grades.

In higher grades a greater breadth of choices are offered such as Foreign Language, Science (Physics, Chemistry and Biology), History and Society (History and Geography), Physical Education and Health, Art and Comprehensive Practical Studies.

The Comprehensive Practical Studies aim at improving students' creativity and research capability, as well as helping students develop a sense of social responsibility through practical experiences.

Although China's long-term education reform is a huge step in their education model, schools still heavily rely on textbook-based learning and tend to use lots of standardized assessments.

A typical school structure following a Chinese curriculum looks like:

Preschool (Ages 2-6)

Junior School (Ages 12-14)

Primary (Ages 6-11)

Secondary School (Ages 15-17)

Thai Curriculum

All Thai private and government schools must follow the Thai Curriculum set out by the Ministry of Education (MOE). Eight educational subjects are taught including; Thai language, Mathematics, Science, Social & Religious and Culture, Health & Physical Science, Professional Work & Technology, Foreign Language, and Arts.

Most Thai and Bilingual Schools still follow the rote learning style of learning - memorizing and textbook teaching. Some have adapted to a more modern critical thinking and project-based learning approach.

Thai and Bilingual Schools are also assessment based with students sitting a succession of long tests annually. In addition, National Exams are given at the end of the third, sixth, and ninth years.

Note, that to attend Thai secondary school, students must have completed Thai or Bilingual primary school and received the Certificate of Primary Education.

Thai and Bilingual Schools' educational levels are organized as such:

Anuban 1-3 (Ages 1-3)

Mathatom 1-6 (Ages 12-18)

Prathom 1-6 (Ages 5-12)

Play Based





The play-based approach involves both child-initiated and teacher-supported learning. The teacher encourages children's learning and inquiry through interactions that aim to stretch their thinking to higher levels.

For example, when children play with blocks, a teacher can pose questions that encourage problem-solving, prediction, and hypothesizing. The teacher also brings the child's awareness towards mathematics, Science, and Literacy (Reading and Writing) concepts.


Inquiry-based question examples may include, How tall can this get? How many blocks do you need? Can you blow the house down? How? Who or what else can do that? These simple questions elevate the simple stacking blocks to a variety of applications of learning.

Through play-based learning like this, children can develop social and cognitive skills, mature emotionally and gain the self-confidence required to engage in new experiences and environments.

Play-Based Curriculum is based on studies that show children learn best through first-hand experiences. Play motivates, stimulates and supports children in the development of skills, concepts, language acquisition, communication skills, and concentration. During play, children use all of their senses, must convey their thoughts and emotions, explore their environment, and connect what they already know with new knowledge, skills and attitudes.

Play-Based Curriculum is most commonly used in Pre-kindergarten and Kindergarten levels of learning

IPC Curriculum



The International Primary Curriculum (IPC) was created for international schools to meet curriculum needs in varying settings. The IPC is often used in conjunction with another curriculum such as Cambridge, as it's a flexible and adaptive inquiry-based learning tool.

The IPC offers a simple but structured curriculum focused on subject, personal and international learning goals. The IPC helps engage parents with learning, and to understand the relevance of learning in the classroom and at home.

The IPC encourages collaboration and reflection through the assessment of knowledge, skills and understandings which are assessed through rubrics assessing the beginning, developing, and of mastery of skills.

Assessment is done by teachers and children through self-assessment to help engage them with learning and to understand their level of skills and knowledge.

The IPC structures its educational levels as follows:

Milepost 1 (Ages 5-7)

Milepost 3 (Age 9-11)


Milepost 2 (Age 7-9)

Montesorri Curriculum



The Montessori Method is a child-centered learning framework focusing on holistic learning outcomes tailored to each child's developmental needs and interests.

It's quite typical that classrooms are grouped across age groups. For example, one class may be 3-6 year olds learning together and another class may be full of 6-9 year olds.

Montessori students do not typically receive letter or number grades for their work. Instead, the Montessori approach nurtures the motivation that comes from within - the child's natural desire to learn.

The Montessori <u>Curriculum</u> covers five key learning areas; Practical Life, Sensorial, Mathematics, Language and Culture.

Mathematical concepts are introduced to the child using concrete sensorial materials. Initial explorations with sensorial materials encourage children to understand basic mathematical concepts such as learning number recognition, counting and sequencing of numbers.

Language materials are designed to enhance vocabulary and explore both written and spoken language.

Cultural activities lead the child to experience music, stories, artwork and items from the child's community, society and cultural background. Through cultural activities, children develop an awareness and appreciation of the world around them.

Montessori curriculum is typically only followed up to Grade 6 (Ages 11-12).

IB





Curriculum

The International Baccalaureate (IB) programme is popular internationally as it encourages both personal development and academic achievement challenging students to think critically, ask the right questions and think across disciplines.

IB education is offered across four programmes; Primary Years Programme (PYP), Middle Years Programme (MYP), Diploma Programme (DP) and Career-related Programme (CP).

PYP (Ages 3-12)

The PYP for children nurtures and develops young students as caring, active participants in a lifelong journey of learning through a student-centered approach to education. At the end of PYP there is no formal assessment however informal assessments and typically student portfolios are made.

MYP (Ages 11-16)

The MYP is an inclusive and challenging framework that encourages students to make practical connections between their studies and the real world. In the final year of the programme, an optional MYP e-Assessment provides IB-validated grades based on examinations and coursework.


DP (Ages 16-19)

The DP programme aims to develop students with an excellent breadth and depth of knowledge – students who flourish physically, intellectually, emotionally and ethically. To graduate, a multitude of formal and informal assessments will be required including an extended essay of 4,000 words.

CP (Ages 16-19)

The CP is a framework of international education addressing the needs of students engaged in career-related education. It leads to higher education apprenticeships or employment and is familiar to vocational studies.

IPC* Curriculum



The IPC offers an international standard that exceeds the national standards of some of the most respected education systems. It is a curriculum easily adaptable virtually anywhere in the world.

The IPC can be delivered in the languages of English, French, Chinese, or Vietnamese.


The IPC is the most internationally represented chain of preschools spanning across 6 continents.

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The most important thing to consider about an international school is whether it is accredited.

Many schools in Chiang Mai and Thailand have 'international' in their name. This, however, does not mean they are an international school with international teaching standards.

Having ISAT accreditation is the first thing to look for. All real international schools will have more than one accreditation.



International School Association of Thailand

The International Schools Association of Thailand (ISAT) is the unified voice for international education in Thailand. Its membership articulates and promotes high standards of educational quality, ethical practices, and student learning.

ISAT was initially established in 1994 to be a link between its member schools and the Thai Ministry of Education (MOE).

Today, there are 21 ISAT member schools in Chiang Mai. For a school to be truly an international school, it must be accredited by ISAT *and* another international governing accreditation body.

ISAT member schools have been recognized by accreditation organizations such as the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC), the Council of International Schools (CIS) and the Education Development Trust (EDT).

ISAT works closely with its member schools to ensure high standards of education through encouragement of best practices, ethical behaviour and professional development.

International schools must be accredited by ISAT before opening or within a year of opening.



WASC

The Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) is now going by The Accrediting Commission for Schools, Western Association of Schools and Colleges (ACS WASC). It is a world-renowned accrediting association. To become accredited, schools must demonstrate that they provide high-quality learning and model continual self-improvement.

ACS WASC accreditation means a school is focused on setting a mission and goals for its learners. The school is student-oriented and examines student performance continuously, accepting objective evaluation from a team of outside peer professionals trained by ACS WASC.

Why is the ACS WASC accreditation important?

- Assures the school's purposes are appropriate and accomplished through a viable educational program and that it is a trustworthy institution
- Validates the integrity of the school's program and transcripts.
- Facilitates the transfer of credits to other English-speaking schools, which is critical for college/university acceptance worldwide.
- Fosters the ongoing improvement of the school's programs and operations to support student learning.

It takes schools up to 5 years to become accredited by ACS WASC and once accredited they must pass reaccreditation every 2-5 years.



International Baccalaureate

Schools that offer the International Baccalaureate (IB) must be accredited as an IB World School.

The IB is proud of its commitment to providing challenging and unique programmes of education to schools around the world. The authorization process backs up this commitment. As a result of the process, parents and students can be confident that each IB World School, no matter where it is located will be held to the same high standard.

Accredited IB World Schools offer learning-centered and inquiry based curriculum to develop well-rounded, reflective, and compassionate young adults. In addition to providing a rigorous academic programme of high standards, accredited schools place a strong emphasis on the ideals of international understanding and responsible global citizenship.

It takes 2-3 years for schools to become a fully accredited IB World School.



EARCOS

Schools accredited by the East Asia Regional Council of Schools (EARCOS) inspire adult and student learning through leadership and service and foster intercultural understanding, global citizenship and exceptional educational practices within their learning community.

An EARCOS member school works within the East Asia community to:

- <u>Develop</u> collaborative educational partnerships within the region
- <u>Provide</u> targeted and differentiated professional development opportunities for teaching and administrative staff
- <u>Engage</u> students in learning activities across the region that will promote friendship, understanding and global citizenship.

To be an EARCOS accredited school, the school must have been in operation for at least 3 years and be accredited by an internationally recognized educational accreditation group.



EARCOS

Cambridge programmes and qualifications set the global standard for international education. Eachyear, nearly a million Cambridge learners prepare for their future with an education from Cambridge International.

Cambridge schools develop Cambridge learners who are confident, responsible, reflective, innovative and engaged – equipped for success in the modern world.

More than 10,000 schools are part of the Cambridge learning community operating in 160 countries across 9 regions.

Cambridge schools offer staff professional development to support confident, responsible, reflective, innovative and engaged staff. Cambridge offers training, events, and teaching and learning resources to help teachers develop successful learners and improve their professional practice.

It only takes 12 weeks to become a Cambridge-accredited school and most Cambridge schools will follow a British Curriculum.



Council of International Schools

The Council of International Schools (CIS) offers one of the most thorough accreditation processes. CIS accreditation shows a school has achieved high standards of professional performance in international education and commits to continuous improvement.

The quality and rigour of CIS International Accreditation is recognized by ministries and departments of education around the world. The CIS International Accreditation process has been validated and is recognized by the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS) Commission on Accreditation, a body that "accredits the accreditors" in the United States.

CIS International Accreditation is further validated and accepted by other countries internationally as a mark of quality assurance including ONESQA in Thailand, State Departments of Education in Australia, the Council of British International Schools in the UK, and others.

It takes 5 years to become accredited by CIS.



NEASC

A globally recognized standard of excellence, The New England Association of Schools and Colleges (<u>NEASC</u>) accreditation attests to a school's high quality and integrity.

Founded in 1885, NEASC is an independent, voluntary, nonprofit membership organization that partners with over 1,500 public, independent, and international schools worldwide to assess, support, and promote high-quality education.

NEASC aspires to provide a process for meaningful, ongoing whole-school improvement while honoring the unique culture and context of each institution they support.

NEASC serves the educational community and the students by:

- establishing and maintaining high standards of educational excellence
- providing a framework for institutional self-reflection and objective peer review
- serving as a resource and support for ongoing, meaningful whole-school improvement and growth.

It takes 12-18 months to become accredited and then schools are periodically reassessed for NEASC accreditation to continue.


